# VISION ZERO ACADEMY

Vision Zero  
International Course  
**16-20 SEPTEMBER 2024**





Sweden is one of the world's leading countries in the development of road safety with the goal of reducing the number of fatalities and serious injuries in road traffic. Vision Zero is the basis for all road safety work in Sweden.

In 1997, the Swedish Parliament adopted a 'vision zero' goal for road traffic, with the long-term goal that no one would be killed or seriously injured within the road transport system. Vision Zero is an ethical approach, but also constitutes the strategy of forming a safe road transport system. Vision Zero has led to major changes in both working methods and interventions, which will be presented in this course.

### TARGET AUDIENCE

The course is targeted at a broad audience, as we welcome everyone who works in practice with traffic safety issues in various agencies such as government authorities, industry, municipalities, NGOs and academia. It is also highly relevant for experts within UN authorities, development banks, and other international organisations.

### GOALS OF THE COURSE

After the course the participants will have gained a deep understanding of Vision Zero as a policy innovation and how it can affect working methods, as well as how a safe road transport system can be created. Participants will also receive a platform for the understanding of how to continue the work with road safety issues in their respective countries.

### COURSE INFORMATION

For the sixth time we will now offer the Vision Zero International Course in Gothenburg on September 16<sup>th</sup> to 20<sup>th</sup> 2024. During the course, interesting lectures will be mixed with study visits to clearly exemplify the Swedish model. At the end of the course the participants will receive a diploma as proof of participation.

## PRICE

The course fee is 20.000 SEK per participant. The course is non-profit and includes accommodation at Radisson Blu Riverside hotel, from 15<sup>th</sup> to 21<sup>th</sup> of September 2024, all documentation, study visits, breakfast, coffee and snacks in the morning and afternoon, as well as lunch, Monday through Friday. Also included is a group dinner for all participants on the evening of Wednesday September 18<sup>th</sup>.
