The road to 2030: road safety management

 Speedy action is of the essence

- Targets and KPIs
- EU Road Safety Agency



The road to 2030: behaviour

- Speed limit recommendation for all roads
- Drink-driving zero tolerance limits – boost alcohol interlocks
- Drug-driving & Distraction

Expected Proposals:

- Ambitious new driving licence rules
- Cross-border enforcement Directive update



The road to 2030: infrastructure

- Designate maximum number of primary roads.
- Apply new Network Wide Assessment.
- Protect pedestrians and cyclists post-Covid.



The road to 2030: vehicle safety

- Strong and timely legislation (avoid rollback e.g. Intelligent Speed Assistance and event data recorders)
- Revise vehicle safety regulation (GSR) well before 2030
- Roadworthiness Update



The 2030: post-crash

• Extend eCall to other vehicle categories now

• Emergency corridors

• Better coordination between transport and health sectors



EU Road Safety Policy Framework 2021-2030 Recommendations on next steps towards 'Vision Zero' European Parliament Report



Inspiration



- Halved the number of road deaths over the period 2011-2021
- A long-term national road safety programme with a target of further reducing deaths by 50% by 2030, with Vision Zero by 2050
- In-depth collision investigation of all fatal vehicle crashes since 2019
- Developing a new Traffic Collision Information System
- A nationwide programme audit and improve pedestrian crossings

EU Road Safety Exchange I

- Pilot project launched by the European Commission, funded by the European Parliament.
- Managed by ETSC
- Supported exchange of knowledge and best practice between EU Member States
- 12 participating countries: Bulgaria, Greece, Lithuania, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Austria, Ireland, France, Spain, Netherlands, Sweden
- The activities included thematic workshops, study visits, final conference in Brussels
